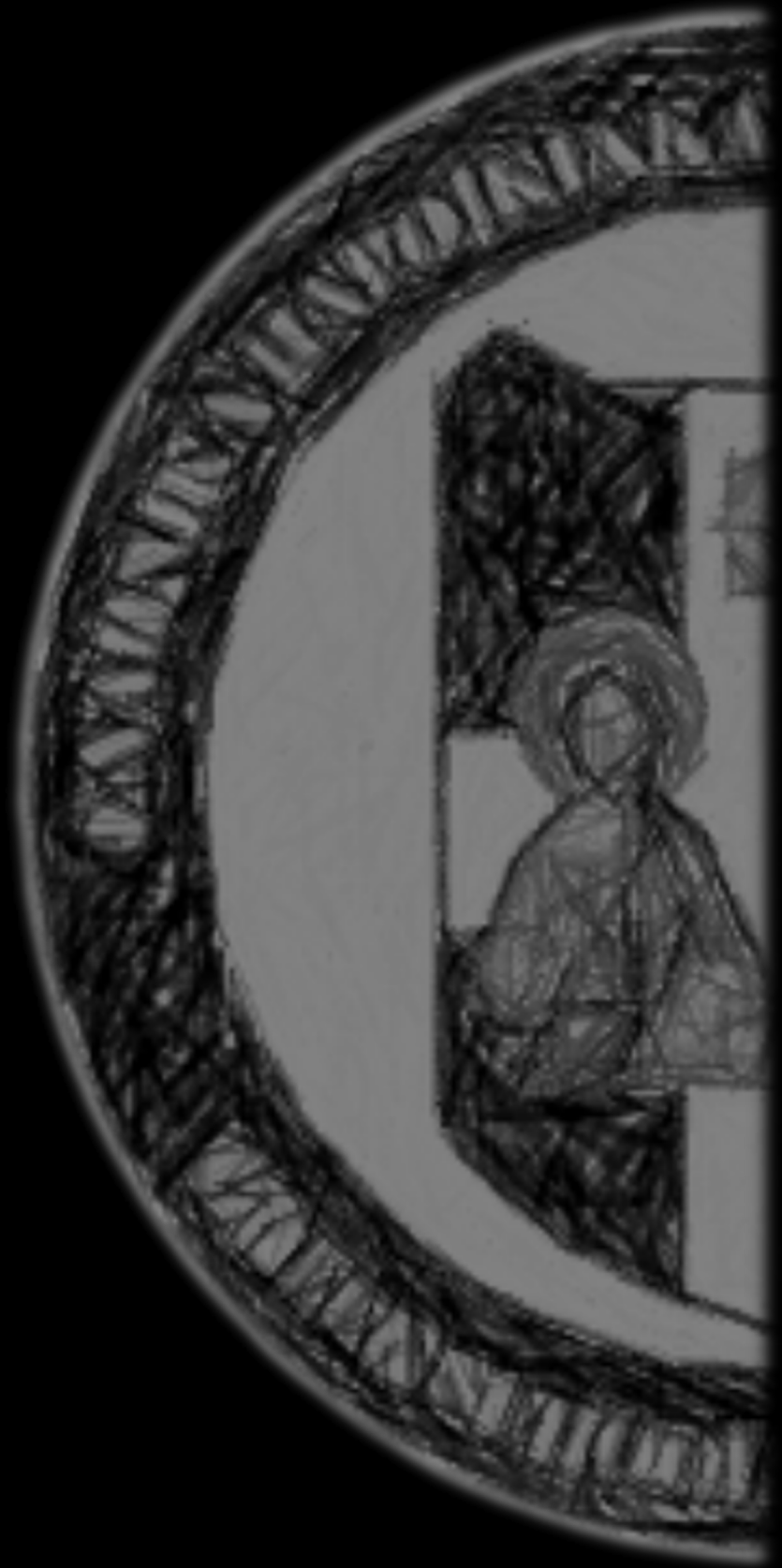

Starting Age Nursery-Reception

The Greek School of Ayia Triada Birmingham recognizes the critical role of early childhood education in fostering children's proficiency and connection with their Greek language and cultural heritage. Extensive research in developmental psychology and linguistics supports the notion that early exposure to language and cultural practices significantly influences children's linguistic and socio-cultural development.

Therefore, in 2008, the Management Board made a strategic decision to initiate admission to GSAT from the age of 3 years and 6 months, aligning with the developmental milestones observed in children's language acquisition and cognitive development. This early start not only facilitates a seamless transition into the school environment but also allows children to immerse themselves in Greek language and cultural experiences, akin to their counterparts in mainstream English schools.

Early years education at GSAT spans two formative years, during which children engage in a structured curriculum designed to nurture their linguistic, cognitive, social, and emotional skills. The overarching objective is to prepare children for the transition to Year 1 by the age of 5 years and 6 months (for September start),

ensuring they possess a strong foundation in both Greek language proficiency and cultural literacy.

It's noteworthy that the duration of admission in Nursery and Reception years may be extended up to 3 years in certain cases. This accommodation is made for children with additional needs or those who may require more time to progress academically or socially. Such flexibility in admission duration is implemented with utmost consideration for the individual needs and well-being of the child, and with the informed consent of their parents or guardians.

In summary, the early initiation of education at GSAT not only serves as a means to preserve and promote Greek language and heritage but also aligns with contemporary educational principles grounded in developmental science. By providing a nurturing and enriching learning environment from an early age, GSAT endeavours to empower children to become proficient bilingual and bicultural individuals, equipped with the skills and knowledge to thrive in an increasingly interconnected world.

Mid-Year Admissions Policy
